Purpose These awards recognize project performed by Texas Public Works personnel, from design/planning to construction. An award may be issued for each of the categories below:

- Structures
- Transportation
- Environmental/Water/Wastewater
- Historical Restoration/Preservation
- Disaster or Emergency Construction//Repair

Eligibility Candidates must be employed full-time by a Texas public agency.

Selection The TPWA Awards Committee reviews the nominations and selects the award winner based on innovation, cost savings, and public benefit.

Nomination Nominations must be made by a Texas Chapter member. The original submittal should include the nomination form and documentation supporting the purpose of the award and the award's eligibility requirements. Submit an electronic copy in PDF format to the Awards Committee Chair, Joe duMenil, JDUMENIL@LNVINC.COM.

Address the following areas in supporting documentation and adhere to the below sequence when possible:

- Purpose, description of project and cost
- Construction schedule, management, and control techniques used.
- Safety performance including overall safety program employed during the construction phase.
- Environmental considerations including special steps taken to preserve and protect the environment, endangered species, etc., during the construction phase.
- Community relations – a summary of the efforts by the agency to protect public lives and property, minimize public inconvenience, and improve relations.
- Unusual accomplishments under adverse conditions, including but not limited to, adverse weather, soil or site conditions, or other occurrences over which there was no control.
- Additional considerations you would like to bring to the attention of the project review panel such as innovations in technology and/or management applications during the project.
